

Economy

Diversified Economy, Better Jobs

- New Direction on Taxation while maintaining a simple tax system and low tax rate, adopt finance and tax measures that promote growth of industries and enterprises, as well as social and economic development
- Hold a "Summit on the New Direction for Taxation" to formulate visionary approaches
- Set up a "Financial Leaders Forum" to explore further development of the financial sector
- Introduce a two-tier profits tax system to reduce the tax burden on enterprises, especially small, medium and startup enterprises



(i) Transportation - Providing Relief, **Enhancing Convenience**




- · Government to use its MTR dividends to lower long-trip fares
- Ask MTR to introduce free Wi-Fi on all trains
- Ask MTR to develop more effective non-peak concessions to reduce crowding

(ii) Housing - Home Ownership, **Liveable City**



- Consider allowing owners of Home Ownership Scheme flats with unpaid land premium to let their
- Establish a task force to facilitate community discussion on boosting land supply. Make decisive choices based on their recommendations
- Upgrade public wet markets to increase choice for the community



(iii) Medical Services - Expanding Services, Boosting Quality



- Implement the HK\$200 billion. 10-year Public Hospital Development Plan
- Consider expanding the scale of the Chinese University of Hong Kong Medical Centre under construction
- · Formulate long-term professional healthcare manpower policy: ensure all local medical graduates have employment opportunities in the public healthcare system; decide on positioning of Chinese medicine: enhance overall quality of public healthcare
- Introduce statutory registration for health professionals such as clinical psychologists, speech therapists, and dieticians

(iv) Social Welfare - Helping the Poor and Disadvantaged, Care for the **Elderly and Young**



- Implement improvements to the Old Age Living Allowance
- · Discuss with social welfare sector how to optimise Lump Sum Grant arrangements
- Set up a Children's Commission to co-ordinate expert and stakeholder efforts to nurture our children and to promote their interest

(v) Environmental Protection -Improving Quality, Beautifying Victoria Harbour



- Ensure that Hong Kong achieves the goal of reducing waste by 40% in 10 years
- Devote resources for the conservation of country parks and natural environment
- Establish a Harbourfront Authority to manage sustainable development of a world-class harbourfront for the enjoyment of the public and tourists

Education

Professional-led **Quality Education**

Immediate increase of HK\$5 billion a year in recurrent expenditure on education



Provide a stable teaching and learning environment

Examples:



Establish a pay scale for kindergarten



contract teaching posts to permanent posts



secondary school graduates to pursue dearee programmes at self-financing tertiary institutions



Reduce pressure on new graduates in paying back

Comprehensive Review on Education System

Examples:

- Establish a professional ladder for teachers
- Strengthen the promotion of STEM education, early introduction of computer coding
- Make Chinese History a standalone and compulsory subject for junior secondary school students
- · Care for the physical, mental and spiritual needs of students, provide a happy learning environment



Youth

Engagement of Youth

- Work with young people to resolve challenges in education, career development and home ownership
- Establish the Youth Development Commission to be chaired by the Chief Secretary for Administration to co-ordinate all relevant efforts
- Enhance participation in policy discussion: Regular visits by the Chief Executive and Principal Officials to schools. Deployment of different channels including social media to strengthen dialogue
- Enhance participation in policy formulation through membership in statutory and advisory committees
- Enhance participation in policy implementation: Revamp the Central Policy Unit into a policy and project co-ordination unit. Recruit 20-30 young people to join the Unit
